The Advent of our Lord



- 1. Hope The Prophets' Candle
- 2. Peace Bethlehem's Candle
- 3. Joy The Shepherds' Candle
- 4. Love The Angels' Candle
- 5. Christmas Eve Christ Candle and all others
- 6. Christmas Day Christ Candle and all others



The order for lighting the candles done by each family:

- 1. Light the Altar candles
- 2. Light the first candle of the wreath (and so subsequently on each Advent Sunday)
- 3. Reading from God's Word
- 4. Brief meditation on the Scripture read
- 5. Prayer
- 6. Song by the entire congregation "Christ Came Down that we may have Hope...Peace...Joy... Love.

The order for lighting the Advent wreath's candles may be used in a family or group setting as well. It provides special occasion to read God's promises of the Messiah and the fulfillment in the coming of Jesus to save us.

On October 27, Faith Lutheran Church and the Fellowships celebrated Reformation in a joint service. All Scripture readings, hymns, songs and prayers focused on the Scriptural foundations proclaimed by Martin Luther and the Reformers. They are: Scripture Alone, Grace Alone, Faith Alone and Christ Alone for the life and salvation of all people. The worship was followed by a potluck shared with some of the Fellowships at Faith. Faith's Fellowships are: English, Chinese, Koreans, Oromos and Spanish. We thank and praise our Lord for keeping us faithful and joint in the true Biblical faith lived and proclaimed by the Church of the Reformation.



Martin Luther created the colourful "Luther's Rose" to explain the core biblical teaching about our salvation. It has been used to teach people about God's plan of salvation for all. Here is how he explains the symbolism of the 'Rose':

Grace and Peace in Christ! Since you ask whether my seal has come out correctly, I shall answer most amiably and tell you of those thoughts which now come to my mind about my seal as a symbol of my theology.

There is first to be a cross, black, and placed in a heart, which should be of its natural color (red), to put me in mind that faith in Christ crucified saved us. For if one believes from the heart, he will be justified. ["For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right God, and it is by confessing with your mouth that you are saved." —Romans 10:10] Even though it is a black cross, which mortifies and which also should hurt us, yet it leaves the heart in its natural color and does not ruin nature...that is, the cross does not kill, but keeps man alive. For the just shall live by faith, by faith in the Savior. ["This Good News tells us how God makes us right in His sight. This is accomplished from start to finish by faith. As the Scriptures say, "It is through faith that a righteous person has life." —Romans 1:17]

Such a heart is to be in the midst of a white rose, to symbolize that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace. In a word, it places the believer into a white joyful rose, for this faith does not give peace and joy as the world gives. ["I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give isn't like the peace the world gives. So don't be troubled or afraid." —John 14:27].

Therefore, the rose is to be white, not red, for white is the color of the spirits and of all angels. ["... an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and rolled aside the stone and sat on it. His face shone like lightning, and his clothing was as white as snow." —Matthew 28:2b-3 and "She saw two white-robed angels sitting at the head and foot of the place where the body of Jesus had been lying." —John 20:12].

This rose, moreover, is fixed in a sky-blue field, symbolizing that such joy in the Spirit and in faith is a beginning of the future heavenly joy. It is already a part of faith, and is grasped through hope, even though not yet manifest.

And around this field is a golden ring, to signify that such bliss in heaven is endless, and more precious than all joys and goods, just as gold is the most valuable and precious metal. May Christ, our dear Lord, be with your spirit until the life to come. Amen.
